Grading:

The, from Eugene Domagata, proposed criteria for recognition of grading of JJIF find general acceptance. JJIF will only propose the promotion of personalities to the National federation and CAN recognize grades on the international level.

Mario den Edel presented a program for the grading of Ju-Jitsu ka. This program shall be a base, guideline and help for National federations to work on their own standards of grading.

JJIF might support the NFs with appropriate examiners to guarantee the quality and acceptance of grades in JJIF member federations (especially for high ranks of leading persons) – So done during the convention an examination for Colince Tatsa Tschinda 6th degree by Marion den Edel and Heinz Lamade.

U15 rules:

The discussions for the finalization of the rules U 15 was held in the dojo.

Process:

- 1. The Rules under 15 years had been discussed in the Technical Congress 2013!
- 2. We have decisions from this technical congress and the general assembly accepted these decisions. (With this the work of the group developing the rules should have been finalized.)
- 3. The open Points to this decision had been subject of a workshop during the JJIF convention 2014 The workshop was prepared with all documents sent out in July and uploaded to the JJIF webpage. During this workshop we agreed on the attached version of rules with the agreement that during the upcoming World Cup U15 (Balkan Championship) controlled contact in Part 1 to the head will be accepted as legal technique.
- 4. Another discussion with no further results was held the next day.

Education System

Analyses:

First level of License in most nations between 100 – 200 LE (LE = 45 min)

further levels contain around additional 60 to 200 LE this depends mainly on structures of professional or volunteer systems in the countries.

Proposal for implementing a basic (first) level of instructor license:

This level shall be mandatory for the international referee and coach license!

The objective is to have finally 120 LE of education. National licenses can be recognized.

The following steps:

- 1. JJIF will develop a curriculum for 40 LE (1 week seminar)

 JJIF will offer a common Seminar but the NF or regions may conduct this seminar as well.

 We will purchase material as online course as well.
- 2. An additional 3 days course will be conducted by JJIF to harmonize and test the knowledge (24 LE) Personal presence is mandatory here - a test will be held

With seminar 1 + 2 the requirements of the Basic license are fulfilled for the period of 2 years.

- 3. JJIF will develop a curriculum for 40 LE (1 week seminar)

 JJIF will offer a common Seminar but the NF or regions may conduct this seminar as well.

 We will purchase material as online course as well.
- 4. An additional 3 days course will be conducted by JJIF to harmonize and test the knowledge (24 LE) Personal presence is mandatory here - a test will be held

With seminar 3 + 4 the Basic license is fully achieved and valid for the period of 4 years. (Refreshments can be done in 2 days)

Further education levels will be developed
