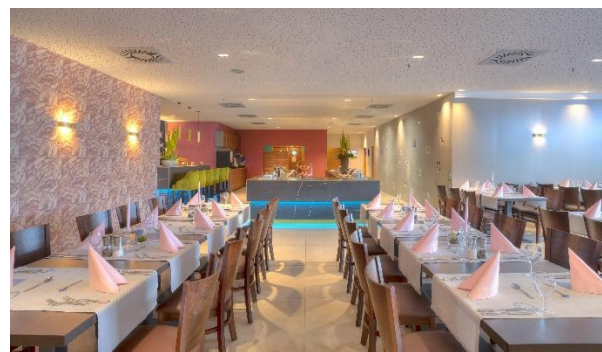


5. Hotels and Transport

The organiser is providing one official hotel for all delegations, in order to facilitate the meetings, the registration and we appointed official hotel, as well as reasonable package prices for all participants. All official meetings will take place in the main official hotel.

We cannot and will not accept a booking in other hotels than the hotels offered by DJJV due to the Covid-19 regulations of the Country.

The Main official hotel is Michel Hotel Maintal.



The average pricing (in EURO) for all the hotels we use are set like, per person per night (including full-board):

Single room	Double room
160	115

You need to fill the Excel sheet with the rooms needed by your team.

The hotels are all approximately 5 min walk (250 m) from the Sports Hall. The hotel facilities include a conference centre, one restaurant, free wi-fi in all rooms, parking, a lobby bar.

In case of a high number of participants, the organisers will provide additional hotels within walking distance to the venue.

6. How to reach the locality in Maintal Germany

a. Via Car

The hotel and the venue are within walking distance (250 m) towards each other.

You can park directly at the hotel on 120 outdoor parking spaces and 32 garage spaces. The cost is € 8.00 per day.

b. Via Train

The hotel and the venue are within walking distance (900m) to the Railway station **Maintal Ost** which has an excellent connection to **Frankfurt Central** and **Frankfurt Airport**.

Many international high-speed trains stop in Frankfurt Central Station. It takes an average of 30 min to **Maintal Ost** by train, and there are about 40 connections per day. There are similar connections from Frankfurt Airport.

We recommend you book via <https://www.bahn.com/> and choose "**Maintal Ost**" as the final destination.

c. Via Airplane

Frankfurt Airport is a major international airport located in Frankfurt, the fifth-largest city of Germany and one of the world's leading financial centres. Its located 25km away from the venue.

d. VISA

People with passports from the following countries need a visa: **Russia**

Please note: The visa waiver for the other countries applies only to holders of biometric passports.

e. Transport to the venue

The LOC will arrange guidance to Maintal Ost from out the airport of Frankfurt. Guides will be at the airport to hand you over to (direct) regional trains. The costs for the trains are in the package.

From **Maintal Ost**, we will provide luggage transport to the hotel (only on arrival and departure day). The train station is about 1km away from the sports hall and official hotel.

Please contact the organisers concerning arrivals and provide them with exact information about your arrival and departure (time and date of arrival, flight number etc.), so they can organise everything on time and set up their booth in the airport and ensure that the luggage can be transported.

7. Right to participate and categories

Athletes must be presented and registered by their National Federation. All competitors must have a **legal passport of the nation they represent in the championship**, and a sports passport of their respective nation, a medical certificate, insurance, gender control and the like are the responsibility of the national federation registering the athletes.

Following 2019 JJIF TC and Congress decision in Abu Dhabi: **max 2 (two) persons/couples** per category are allowed, with an overall quota of 14 (fourteen) women and 14 (fourteen) men for Jiu-Jitsu (Ne-Waza), 14 (fourteen) women and 14 (fourteen) men for Fighting, 6 (six) couples for Duo and 6 (six) couples for Show.

Competitors that will reach the proper age in the present year (from 1.1 to 12.31) have the right of participation in the designated category (valid for Fighting, Jiu-Jitsu Ne-Waza, Duo and Show systems). **No athlete younger than 18 years old is allowed to compete.**

Control of entries and issuing of accreditation cards will take place at the main official hotel in a time frame starting at Friday, July 16th till Wednesday, July 21st, registration and accreditation. At least one team official must attend in time to confirm the presence of all athletes and officials. The team official must be able to show all official documents and passports of all team members (copies are accepted).

An accreditation card shall be issued to all competitors, officials and crew members and should be carried at all times. Be aware that accreditation can only be used by athletes on their competition day. If an athlete competes in several disciplines, he receives accreditation for every competition day he has to play.

Paid athletes are not allowed to participate according to §67a General Tax Code

Categories – ADULTS

Duo system:

- Men, Women and Mixed

Show system:

- Men, Women and Mixed

Fighting system:

- Men -56 kg, -62 kg, -69 kg, -77 kg, -85 kg, -94 kg, +94 kg
- Women -45 kg, -48 kg, -52 kg, -57 kg, -63 kg, -70 kg, +70 kg

Jiu-Jitsu Ne-Waza:

- Men -56, -62, -69, -77, -85, -94, +94
- Women -45 kg, -48 kg, -52 kg, -57 kg, -63 kg, -70 kg, +70 kg

If a competitor participates in the Duo competition, he/she is allowed to be part of a mixed couple and of a couple of his/her gender. The athlete is allowed to compete on the same tournament in Show, also part of a mixed couple and of a couple of his/her gender. The organiser will observe that the Duo men and women are scheduled for one competition day, while the mixed duo is scheduled for the other day. The same is valid for the Show system.

8. Competition fees

Adults:

Fighting system –	€ 150/competitor
Jiu-Jitsu Ne-Waza system -	€ 150/competitor
Duo system –	€ 150 /couple/system
Show system –	€ 150/couple/system

(fee contains: € 60 competition fee (including covid-test at the competition day), € 80 referee fee, € 10 Anti-doping control fee)

Coaches/Medic/Officials € 20 per person/day

(Due to the Covid Hygiene Protocol everyone will need to get tested every day before entering the sports hall)

The amounts must be paid to the Organizing Committee, at the latest, on the deadline indicated in the invitation. Late payments carry a € 10 penalty/person, and they must reach the account of the organisers before the moment of physical registration in the official hotel.

9. Competition uniform and back numbers

All competitors must have and use judogi according to the JJEU and JJIF rules for official competitions (**white gi for all competition systems**).

Soft hand and foot protection in proper colour; mouthpiece and jockstrap are strongly recommended; chest protectors for female competitors are strongly recommended.

The JJEU is using a different system for the **back numbers** used by athletes in the official JJEU competitions. The national federations purchase the special back numbers for the event, online, at the following link, from Ju-Sports, the premium sponsor of the JJEU

The JJNOs are then responsible to give the back numbers to the athletes, so they can apply them to their gi prior to the competition. The national federations must pay the back numbers for their athletes by themselves. Participating without an official back number is not allowed.

10. Advertising

Please observe the regulations of the JJIF as far as advertising on the judogi is concerned. Please note that during the championship, no numbers on the back of the judogi are allowed, except as specified at point 9 above. Numbers on the back, from previous tournaments, must be removed from the judogi.

11. Referees

For the upcoming European Championship in the JJEU and DJJV will be able to provide some compensation to the selected referees in terms of travel and accommodation.

The JJEU Board and JJEU Referee Committee is entrusted the task to select the qualified referees for the event.

12. Rules and draw

- JJIF Competition Rules, Organization and Sporting Code of JJIF. We make an appeal to all participants to respect fair-play and JJIF Book of Ethics! (*actual competition rules are provided also on the official web site of JJEU www.jjeu.eu and of JJIF www.jjif.org*);
- SportData software, approved by JJEU/JJIF, used for, draw/seeding and running the competition;
- SportsID software, approved by JJEU/JJIF, used for registration;
- Draw will be made by the JJEU Sport Director and the responsible official from the National Federation, together with the IT specialist;
- The draw will be done on **Friday** for all competition days, and it is final!
- If a competitor will not have the correct weight at weighing – or the birth dates are not correct -, he/she will stay in a pool/table but will automatically lose the match. No change will be made to the draw, and no refund will be granted because of not fulfilling conditions for participation when already registered. **There will be no second draw.**
- General mistakes discovered at the draw can be corrected by JJEU officials (such as wrong name, persons with similar names put in wrong categories etc.).
- Seeding regulations of the JJIF will be observed. For the seeding the **world ranking list and registration** from **July 10th** will be used. The JJNOs are responsible to make sure all points are correct in the raking list

13. Appeal

The Appeal Committee of the Event is composed of 3 persons (1 from the local organising committee), appointed by the JJEU Board. Any member of the Appeal Committee is to be excluded from making any decisions if the participant involved is from the same Country.

The Appeal procedure adopted by the JJIF Congress in November 2018 is applicable.

14. Anti-doping Control

All members should make their competitors aware that there could be a doping control for several athletes in Fighting or duo system. All athletes, coaches and officials who join the European Championships in 2021 as representative MUST follow the Anti-Doping E-Learning platform at <https://adel.wada-ama.org/en> and sent the result at least 3 weeks before the European championship to office@jjeu.eu

All members should make their competitors aware that there could be a doping control for several athletes. We concern to the WADA code for Anti-doping! By entering the championship, you accept the JJIF Anti-Doping regulations.

You will need a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) by use of any drugs on the list. JJEU/JJIF automatically recognises all TUEs issued by National Anti-Doping Organizations (NADOs), so please contact your NADO if you need a TUE and do not already have one.

If you have any difficulty in applying for a TUE through your NADO or there is no NADO in your Country, please contact the Independent Testing Authority (ITA) under the IOC (jjif@ita.sport).

15. Trophies

- At the end of each competition day there will be a trophy for the best three countries, in the overall competition (Fighting + Jiu-Jitsu + Duo + Show);
- First three in each category receive a medal;
- The Fair-Play Trophy and other special trophies will be awarded.

16. Liability

Neither the organisers of the event, nor the National Federation (or any of its officials or members) will be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to any property arising out of participation and travelling in connection with this championship.

Coaches and team leader are responsible to make sure that all participants are physically fit, prepared and capable to cope with a championship.

a. GDPR

By participating in this event, each participant or his/her guardian agrees to the use of his/her personal data in accordance with the GDPR within the scope of the data protection notice, which can be found on the homepage of the DJJV - www.djvv.de - under Datenschutz.

Participation in and attendance at events organised by the DJJV and the national associations shall entail the consent of agents to the publication of photographs and films taken by them in the publications of the JJIF, the DJJV and the national associations.

By registering for this championship, the athlete accepts that the following personal data will be published, and may be used for the processing of competition data by the Sportdata programs in accordance with the privacy policy of these services: First name, last name, sex, date of birth, age group, weight, Weight class, club (incl. national association and country).

17. Dress code

Coaches accompanying the athletes to the tatami will wear the national team tracksuit with sports shoes (closed). For the finals, formal clothes (with jacket) are recommended.

Athletes on the podium will wear the white competition Gi, without any additional materials on their persons (flags, religious symbols, bottles of water, slippers etc.), according to SportAccord guidelines. See JJIF Sporting code for details

18. Flags and Anthems

Don't forget to check the flag and anthem of your Country with the organiser when you arrive. We suggest that you bring with you your national anthem (short version) to avoid any possible problem.

19. Financial conditions and deadlines

Travel expenses and organisation are the responsibility of the participating countries. The cost for the accommodation and the participation must be paid by each federation to the organiser.

Payment must be done by bank transfer up to *JUNE 14TH 2021*.

DJJV offers the possibility to book PCR tests for your flight back home, the costs are will be provided soon, you can book your tests per departure day during accreditation, and the total amount has to be paid cash or via credit card during accreditation.

Once your hotel booking form reaches us, you will receive a proforma invoice, with the payment details.

Federations which settle all their obligations on time will go through the "green line" at accreditation, in the allotted time interval.

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Registration of competitors	Monday, June 07 th 2021
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Important: An extra fee of **10 EUR per person** is required for **registrations** made after **June 07th 2021**, and/or payments made after **14th of June** unless its otherwise specified in the invoice. All competitors, coaches and officials must be registered in time. After the final entry deadline, all additional persons will be charged the penalties indicated above.

No refunds for participants not attending the event will be made. Replacement of competitors is only permitted in case of an injury.

Transfer/payment receipt has to be shown at **accreditation**. Please note that all financial obligations must be fulfilled before the registration!

20. Registration to the event

Only in writing up to **June 07th 2021**, via the online platform **SportsID** for ADULTS : (<https://www.sportdata.org/>).

21. Covid rules and regulations in this particular event

All who attend this event as Athlete, Coach, Delegate or Medical Support staff should be aware that:

- When flying to Germany you need a negative PCR test
- At weigh in or control of duo/show you have to provide a negative PCR test result which is not older than 48hrs. **All coaches/referees/officials/medic/media will be tested again, before entering the venue using a quickest.**
- Not following the JJEU Covid protocol can cause disqualification of the athletes or even the whole team.
- No parents, children, spectators, or any other relatives or friends, or non-official accredited people will be accepted by the LOC. DJJV and JJEU.
- **Only 3 coaches will be accredited per day, only 1 medical support person will be accredited, team delegates will not be allowed in the competition area. Please let us know the accreditation days via mail**
- JJEU appointed a Medical Protocol Manager, together with the local Covid Protocol team the JJEU manager has the ability to warn and send people away of not following the JJEU Covid protocol.
- When feeling sick stay at home or at your hotel.
- When tested Positive on Covid, you will be placed in Quarantine.
- After the event, you are free to do whatever you want but NOT under the support and insurance of JJEU and DJJV anymore. National Federation can use the Excel sheet for airport and hotel rooms to request tests for the team.
- DJJV can organise, if necessary, your PCR test to be accepted to fly home (of course the company will only accept a Negative test)
 - a. Extra information regarding arrival in Germany:**
 - Every participant (Athletes, coaches, referees) must register via: <https://www.einreiseanmeldung.de/#/> (max 72hrs) before arrival in Germany if they are coming from "Risk, High-Risk, or Virus variation Area". You can use this website to check if/which status apply for your Country.
 - In any case people arriving via airplane need to provide a negative PCR test.
 - People arriving via car/train the type of test of the will vary

 - To avoid quarantine the DJJV will provide letters to the JJNOs confirming that the participants are taking part in a top sport event.
 - The letters must be printed out by the National Federation themselves and MUST be hand overed to all who travel to Germany

Legality and right to participate We are fully aware that all competitors must have a legal passport and sports passport of their respective nation! A medical certificate is needed, not older than 12 months, certifying their fitness for competition. Competitors that will reach the proper age in the present year (from 1.1 to 31.12) have the right of participation in designated category (valid for Fighting, duo, show and jiu-jitsu systems).

Responsibility We hereby attest the responsibility that coaches and team leader are responsible to make sure that all participants are physically fit, prepared and capable to cope with a championship.

Liability We understand and recognise the right to the O.C., JJEU and National Federation not to accept any liability what so ever. Neither the organisers of the event, nor the Deutscher Ju-Jutsu Verband e.V. or JJEU (or any of its officials or members) will be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to any property arising out of participation and travelling in connection to this championship.

Anti-doping We are aware that there could be a doping control for several athletes in fighting, jiu-jitsu, duo or show systems.
